at the Faculty of Natural Sciences offers a tenured

full professorship for psychotherapy / psychotherapy research

The professorship should represent the subject of psychotherapy at the Department of Psychology in research and teaching. The Department of Psychology offers a highly stimulating research environment and comprehensive research infrastructure including psychophysiological laboratories for measuring emotions and stress, a neuroendocrinological laboratory, as well as EEG and imaging (fMRI, MEG) and eye tracking exclusively for research purposes. The research profile of the professorship lies in the field of psychotherapy research, whereby new findings from quantitative-empirical psychology on the development and maintenance of mental disorders are utilized to derive effective psychotherapeutic measures. The professorship teaches psychotherapy in the bachelor's and master's programme in psychology and contributes to the field of psychological counseling. The professorship heads the Center for Counseling in Clinical Psychology, Psychotherapy and Health Psychology at the Department of Psychology and is involved in the pertinent teaching programme. Applications from all areas of psychotherapy research are welcome; content-related references to clinical psychology or health psychology are welcomed.

General employment requirements are:

1. A completed domestic or equivalent foreign higher education (doctorate) corresponding to the position;
2. Relevant habilitation or equivalent scientific qualification;
3. Completed psychotherapeutic training (entry in the list of psychotherapists or a license to practice psychotherapy comparable to Austrian standards, with a realistic prospect of accreditation in Austria within 3 years);
4. Excellent research and publication achievements in the field of psychotherapy research;
5. Evidence of integration into the international scientific community;
6. Pedagogical and university didactic experience;
7. Administrative and social skills; and
8. Good knowledge of German, spoken and written.

In addition, the following is expected:

1. Participation in research and teaching collaborations of the Paris Lodron University Salzburg and their further development;
2. Willingness to work in university bodies and in university self-administration;
3. Experience in modern science management, especially in the competitive acquisition of third-party funding through national and international research funds;
4. Willingness to cooperate, interdisciplinarity, and social competence;
5. Openness to open-science principles (pre-registration, open data);

6. Experience with randomized clinical trial designs;
7. Willingness and qualification to take on management positions; and
8. Ability to hold courses and exams in English.

Admission to tenured full-time employment will be in accordance with § 98 University Act (UG) 2002 and the Salaried Employees Act as well as the Collective Agreement for Employees of Universities / employment group A1. Overpayment of the Collective Agreement minimum wage of € 5.321,70 gross (14 monthly salaries) is planned. The University of Salzburg aims to increase the proportion of women in its workforce and therefore invites qualified women to apply. With the same qualifications, women are given priority. People with disabilities or chronic illnesses who meet the required qualification criteria are expressly invited to apply. Unfortunately, the travel and subsistence expenses incurred during the admission procedure cannot be reimbursed.
